RULES OF PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT

The rules of professional conduct for a WMSP Instructor/Chief RiderCoach Trainer incorporate the MSF and ESC standards. These were created to insure that the motorcycle safety courses presented for WMSP are conducted in an efficient, consistent, and professional manner, while insuring quality instruction and maximizing student safety.

THE WASHINGTON MOTORCYCLE SAFETY INSTRUCTOR

- Conducts rider courses that abide by WMSP policies and procedures utilizing only approved curricula.
- Teaches the minimum courses per year.
- Maintains a current and valid driver license, endorsement(s), and satisfactory driving record as required by DOL.
- Maintains current First Aid certification filed with Sponsor(s).
- Exhibits a professional appearance and conduct both on the range and on the street.
- Always sets a proper example for other motorists by never operating a vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.
- When riding, always wears proper riding apparel, as dictated by weather, time of day, and riding conditions.
- Owns and operates on a regular basis a motorcycle that complies with all applicable vehicle laws and codes.
- Is capable of recurrently passing the knowledge and riding skills tests used in WMSP 2-wheel and/or 3-wheel courses as appropriate.
- Maintains the safest possible learning environment for the rider education students at all times.
- Maintains a current working knowledge of:
 - Motor vehicle laws, particularly those that govern motorcycles, mopeds, scooters, etc.

 - Significant changes in the motorcycle industry, pertaining to motorcycle design and safety, protective riding apparel, and motorcycle accessories.
- Participates in and successfully completes instructor update/refresher workshops, professional development activities, and QAV's as defined in the curriculum approved by the DOL Director and WMSP.
- Conducts themselves in a professional manner that includes: appearance, appropriate language in written and verbal communication, positive interaction with others that is free from intimidation, sexual harassment, or threat, and is consistent with the interests of WMSP and student safety.

Failure to adhere to these standards and responsibilities may result in decertification.
